Kyoshi Higashi, 8th dan, was inducted into the Canadian Karate Hall of Fame for his involvement in the development and growth of karate-do in Canada.

Sensei Higashi, former Canadian and North American Karate Champion, has produced such high-level athletes as Dominic Pito, Peter Giffen and especially John Carnio who took home the silver medal in the first world karate championships.

He has been a national referee and is currently a member of the <u>National Karate Association</u> Technical Committee, as well as being the Hombu-Cho of the Chito-Ryu style, representing Soke Sensei in Canada.
